<u>Math</u>: continue working on the math site: Splashlearn (found in the weblinks section). If you completed activities last week, try some different things this week.

<u>Measurement:</u> I need you to take out your data collection of the snow that you did. This week, we are going to use that data and make a bar graph. You will need paper or graph paper (either will work), a ruler and a pencil. Please use your data to make your own bar graph. If you do not have graph/grid paper, it is ok to use other paper. I have left some pictures of my graphs in the gallery of pictures. Check them out.
