Literacy



Words: **jeu, nous, vous, ballon, fête** (these are new words)

- Watch and listen to the video with the words 3 times. The third time, turn the volume off and try reading the words yourself.
- Practice writing and reading the words of the week. Write the words using pyramid writing.

Sound: **M Brun – un**

Books have been assigned to each student on the Je lis! Website. Each book should be read multiple times throughout the week. Please work on things like fluency, expression, and volume. If you feel you are ready, you can record yourself reading and I will listen to it 😊

This week you will be working on a description of a stuffed animal (like a show and tell). Some ideas of what to share:

- Quel animal est ton animal en peluche ? (What is your animal ?)
- De quelle couleur est ton animal en peluche ? (What colour is it ?)
- Est-ce que ton animal fait du bruit ? (Does it make noise ?)
- Est-ce que ton animal est capable de bouger ? (Can it move ?)
- Qui t'as donné ton animal en peluche ? (Who gave it to you?)
- Quand as-tu eu ton animal en peluche ? (When did you get it?)

You are encouraged to share a video of you sharing the information in French. If you are unable to do a video, you may write your information and share it in a picture. I will do an example later this week! You have all week to work on this project 😊

Math



Play Zorbis Math for 20 minutes.

Practice putting numbers in order from smallest to biggest (ordre croissant). Use a deck of cards and take out the 10, J, Q, and K. Flip 2 cards to make a number (ex: flip 3 and 6 number is 36). Make 6 numbers and then put them in order.

In the packet I sent home in November there are some math sheets. Do page 176 - l'ordre croissant (small to big)

- Order the lions from smallest to biggest.
- Write the numbers from smallest to biggest. See 'a' for an example.
