Show your child examples and have them circle the er, ir, or ur and say the word. Examples: fern, herd, bird, firm, turn, burp	When reading with your child have them look for words with er, ir, ur.

	I would prefer all students to do their writing without the use of a computer.	Your child may write about a story of their choice or choose from the following: *Write a sentence about what you like about staying home. Write another sentence about what you dislike about staying home. Write a third sentence about which one you prefer. *Make a list of fun things to do outside.	Have your child use capitals, spacing, periods and details. Each completed writing should consist of at least three sentences. Encourage your child to sound out the words they are spelling. Common words (the, is, you, and) should be spelled correctly.
