

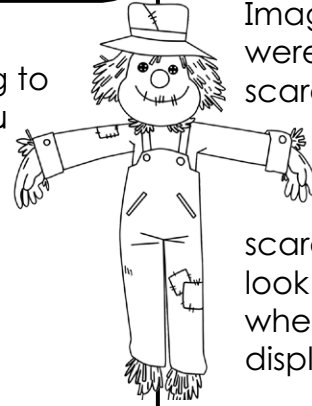
Fall Writing Prompts

Write a poem about a tree losing its leaves.



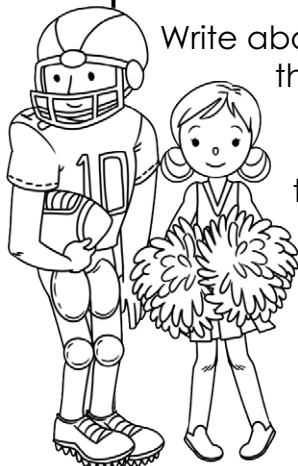
You're in charge of planning a fall craft for a group of four year-old children. Describe the activity, what you'll need, and how you'll set it up. Draw a picture of the craft.
